Anna Gray...formerly of Littleton, was owner of Gray Farm; 103

LITTLETON — Anna (Tullson) Gray, 103, a former resident of Littleton who formerly owned a farm in town and was a member of the First Church Unitarian, died Saturday, Feb. 11, at the Life Care Center of Acton. She was the wife of Wm. Victor Gray, who died in 1956.

She was born in Sweden, April 5, 1902, daughter of the late Ernest and Mary (Timonson) Tullson. She came to the United States as a young girl with her family and settled in Rhode Island. She and her family then went by wagon to Alberta, Canada as a homesteader, where she met and married her husband. In 1922, they came to Littleton and purchased 80 acres of land which became known as Gray Farm. They grew vegetables and fruits and sold them at

their stand on King Street in Littleton. They later kept a dairy herd of about 20 cows for milk.

Mrs. Gray loved children and later became a private nanny for several families in town including the Dr. Edgar and Dr. Ellen Bell family for 10 years.

She was a member of the First Church Unitarian of Littleton.

She wrote poetry and loved gardening.

She is survived by two sons, Laurie Gray of Sebring, Fla., and Eugene Gray of Kennebunkport, Maine; 14 grandchildren; numerous great-grandchildren; and several great-great-grandchildren.

She was also the mother of the late Willis Gray.
