Salvatore Giannetta Littleton, owned Bedford Flooring Co.; 94

LITTLETON — Salvatore Giannetta, 94, a longtime Littleton resident who had his own flooring company while living in Bedford, died yesterday, Oct. 9, at his Great Road home. He was the husband of Nellie (Capone) Giannetta, who died in 1989.

He was born in Naples, Italy on Dec. 10, 1905, a son of Euplio and Lucia (Rigillo) Giannetta. He came to the United States from Italy at the age of 12. lived in the North End of Boston and attended the Michelangelo School. Mr. Giannetta made his home in Bedford for 19 years and Littleton since 1976.

He worked at the Chelsea Shipyard during World War II. Mr. Giannetta learned his trade as a hardwood floor installer with Maurice Schwartz Flooring Co. and eventually began the Sal Giannetta Flooring Co. and Bedford Flooring Co.

He was a member of the Littleton Council on Aging and the Minuteman Elder Services.

Mr. Giannetta is survived by two sons, Salvatore R. Giannetta, residing in California and Bruce Giannetta of Bedford; three daughters, Marilyn Blaisdell of Brookline, N.H., Doris Napoli, and Diane Doucette, both of Littleton; three brothers, Vincent P. Giannetta of Canton, Ohio, Gerard Giannetta residing at the Bedford Veterans Administration Hospital, Anthony Giannetta of Everett; a sister, Mary DeCarlo of Everett; 11 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.
