Peter Gerbi, 88, 280 Great Road, Littleton, died Friday at the Nashoba Community Hospital in Ayer after a brief illness. He was born in Asti, Italy, April 9, 1897, and came to the United States when he was 19 years old.

He served in the U.S. Army during World War I.

He was married to Angela (Accomo) Gerbi in 1921.

He and his wife settled in Rhode Island for a short time and then lived in Maynard and Littleton since 1935.

He was a weaver at United Elastic Company in Littleton for many years.

He wintered in Florida for the last 15 years and his favorite

hobbies were gardening and ice fishing.

He was a member of the American Legion Post 249, the Holy Name Society and the St. Vincent de Paul Society for 15 years. He was a communicant of St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

Besides his wife, he is survived by a son, John P. Gerbi of Littleton; a daughter, Mrs. Andrew (Gloria) Morris of Littleton; a brother, Joseph, of Italy; a sister, Rose, of South America; four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass was held at St. Anne's Church, Littleton, on Monday at 10 a.m. Burial was at Westlawn Cemetery.
