Members of the Commission:

On behalf of our client, Paul Dudley, we request the following waiver to the Town of Littleton Wetlands Protection Regulations that is necessary from the Conservation Commission for the proposed new onsite sewage disposal system.

The lot contains a single-family existing dwelling, paved driveway, shed and an onsite sewage disposal system in failure. There is a Bordering Vegetated Wetland (BVW) that projects the 100-foot Buffer Zone onto the property. A portion of the lot lies within the Flood Plain Conservancy District. The vegetative site coverage is comprised of lawn and lightly wooded areas. Most of the lot is located within the 100' Buffer Zone. The existing sewage disposal system is in failure and must be replaced.

The project includes construction of a new onsite sewage disposal system with the 100-foot Buffer Zone. The proposed septic tank, pump chamber, leach field are located outside of the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone. The limit of work/siltation barrier extends into the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone because the existing septic tank is proposed to be pumped dry, bottom ruptured and backfilled with clean in accordance with Title 5, Section 15.354 "Abandonment of Systems" or disposed offsite.

Town of Littleton Wetlands Protection Bylaw:

1.4 Waiver from Regulations

(1) Strict compliance with these Regulations may be waived when, in the judgment of the Commission, such action is
a) in the public interest, necessary to avoid a taking, necessary to prevent a safety hazard, or water dependent; and
b) consistent with the intent and purpose of the Bylaw; and
c) the least environmentally damaging practicable alternative.

A waiver is necessary to decommission the existing septic tank located within the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone, and it will be an improvement over existing conditions.

4.2 Wetland Setbacks for New Activities and Structures

(2) In the judgment of the Commission, any new activity (other than travel by foot or nonmotorized vehicle or removal of invasive vegetation using proper methods) or structure within 50 feet of a Bank or BVW is likely to alter the Bank or BVW. No new activity or structure (other than the aforesaid travel or removal of invasive vegetation) shall be allowed within the No-Disturbance Area(s) set forth below except under a Waiver as provided in Section 1.4 of these Regulations (or as otherwise provided in these Regulations). This is the minimum distance for the No-Disturbance Area; the distance may be extended further by the Commission if deemed necessary for the protection of the Interests of the Bylaw, up to the outer extent of the Buffer Zone as established in the Bylaw.

a) No-Disturbance Area: This is any area within the BVW or Bank and the first 50 feet of the Buffer Zone from BVW or Bank. No activities or work is permitted other than passive (foot or non-motorized vehicle)

passage and removal of invasive vegetation if done in compliance with these Regulations. Except as noted, no vegetation may be disturbed, and the area should remain unchanged from its pre-project state.

b) Marking the No-Disturbance Area: The commission may require the limits of No-Disturbance be marked prior to construction.


Work within the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone involves the decommissioning of the existing septic tank and temporary impacts in the Buffer Zone associated with the installation of the new septic tank. A waiver is necessary because the existing septic tank is located within 50 feet of the BVW, so it is not possible to decommission it without working in this area. The existing septic tank is proposed to be pumped dry, the bottom ruptured, and then backfilled with clean sand in accordance with Title 5, Section 15.354 "Abandonment of Systems" or disposed offsite. A new septic tank and pump chamber are proposed onsite and are entirely located outside the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone. This will result in an improvement over current conditions within this Buffer Zone because the sewage disposal system is located more than 50 feet from the edge of the Bordering Vegetated Wetlands.

In accordance with the Town of Littleton Wetlands Protection Regulations, it is our belief that the granting of the waiver will provide the most environmentally sensitive design for this site.

What specific action(s) is the waiver being asked for?*

Work within the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone involves the decommissioning of the existing septic tank and temporary impacts in the Buffer Zone associated with the installation of the new septic tank. How is the action(s) in the public interest, necessary to prevent a safety hazard or water dependent?*

This will result in an improvement over current conditions within this Buffer Zone because the sewage disposal system is located more than 50 feet from the edge of the Bordering Vegetated Wetlands.

How is the action(s) consistent with the intent and purpose of the bylaw?*

The proposed disturbance within the 50-foot No-Disturb Zone is temporary.
